GENDER SENSITIZATION ACTIVITIES IN DJ ACADEMY FOR MANAGERIAL EXCELLENCE

1) In Orientation Programme when students join the institution

DJAME conducts Student Orientation programme every year to create an inclusive environment for the new students taking up MBA program. On that basis many activities are conducted for four to five days after the orientation. This way it has few components in the programme as a part of gender sensitization:

1.1: Ice breaking session

Icebreakers can be of invaluable help in creating a learning environment, in which students feel free to experience, reflect and communicate. They are particularly useful for workshops on gender, which are likely to surface conflicting opinions, discomfort and personal biases. In particular, icebreakers can be used to:

- ➤ Provide participants with opportunities to get to know each other.
- > Stimulate the flow of communication among participants.
- ➤ Raise the energy level of participants.
- > Bring personal expectations and the group's reality closer together.
- Encourage everyone to participate and learn.
- > Reinforce learning.
- > Introduce an element of fun.

When students come together to take part in a workshop or training, it is important to make everyone feel welcome and part of the group. Ice breakers are particularly important in helping to set a warm and friendly tone for the workshop. When people meet for the first time, there is often some nervousness and shyness. An icebreaker offer students the following about changing behaviour and instilling empathy into the views that an individual hold about our own and the other genders:

- A safe, clear and acceptable structure.
- ➤ Conversation topics those are interesting and non-threatening.
- ➤ Enough perspective and scope for making and receiving distinct impressions of one another.

> Some action/body movements and laughter, where possible, to relieve the tension.

1.2: En-Culturing & Anti-ragging Squad at DJAME

Enculturation is the process by which people learn the dynamics of their surrounding culture and acquire values and norms appropriate or necessary to that culture and its worldviews. Cultural transmission can occur in various forms, though the most common social methods include observing other individuals, being taught or being instructed. As part of this process, DJAME opt the second method of being taught to limit, direct, or shape the students and orient them towards the institution's Culture, Norms, Rules & Regulations, Code of conduct, Dress code. Students are also given awareness on what constitutes sexual harassment and composition of the committees to regulate all the in disciplinary activities are discussed in this session.

Anti-ragging Squad is to ensure, that there is no instances of ragging anywhere on the campus and hostel. The safety and security of all students is taken care through this squad. In the orientation programme the students are given an insight about this squad and its importance.

1.3: Prevention of Sexual Harassment:

The Prevention of Sexual Harassment (PoSH) at Workplace Act of India mandates every organisation to define their sexual harassment policies, prevention systems, procedures, and service rules for its employees. The students are also intimated about the importance of this law and a brief of what will be considered as harassment, its consequences will be shared to DJAME students in the orientation programme itself.




2) International Men's Day Celebration:

3) Gender Sensitization Programme:

Without being sensitive to the needs of a particular gender, an individual may refrain from understanding the opposite gender. Gender is Socially Learned behaviour, based on social expectation from Men & Women. The women and children are most vulnerable group of this situation. And it's the undue pressure on Boys & Girls to live up to the established norms of Masculinity & femininity. Girls endure unwarranted social control, discrimination & domination. Boys discouraged from being emotional, gentle, or fearful.
